Harry Reflects...

In August, my family and I got to enjoy a holiday to North Wales and the delights of Pwllheli beach. Whilst we were there, we undertook our now traditional project of building a line of one hundred sandcastles, which requires some level of family coordination. I was on 'digging a hole and filling bucket' duty, and the children on 'relaying the buckets and placing the new sandcastle at the end of the line' duty. The line advanced considerably before it occurred to me that to speed up the process, I could dig a new hole nearer the front of the line. There is always one who slows things down! After ninety minutes, we had finished, and then came what the children love, destroying all the sandcastles! I must admit I find this moment rather disheartening. There was that great moment of jubilation at completing our task, and we dutifully captured a photo for posterity, but what took ninety minutes to complete, took mere seconds to destroy. The hard work and labour of digging a big hole on a beach, running backwards and forward, placing sandcastles, gone, in an instant.



This moment brought me back to Ecclesiastes 11:7-12:8, which I had recently preached on at a wedding. Yes – it's an odd one for a wedding. 12: 8 reads,

"Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher. "Everything is meaningless!"

The word meaningless might better be understood as vapour. The sense that everything we have is slowly slipping away as time takes its toll. No matter how tightly we hold onto something, it will in the end fade away, disappear like vapour. In my case, the sandcastles felt the same, either by the sea, the buffeting of the wind, or jubilant children, they were destined to fade away. The hard work gone. Ecclesiastes is a fascinating book but not necessarily an easy read. It speaks regularly of death and the futility of this life, but it is hard to argue with its conclusions. Life does feel a bit like the sandcastles my family built - a labour of hard work, momentarily enjoyed, and then gone.

As Christians, what do we do? Thankfully, Ecclesiastes does give an answer. 12:1 reads

"Remember your Creator in the days of your youth..."

- don't panic, it is unlikely that it means youth in the sense we do. The writer is simply encouraging us to remember God while we still can. As the summer holidays draw to a close and the fleeting British summer ends, we have an opportunity not to be melancholy but hopeful. For as we remember our Creator, we can remember all that He has done for us. God, our Creator, who still looks with compassion upon humanity, longing that they may be in a right relationship with Him. The God who is not an absent Creator but intimately involved in the life of His people and through the work of Christ bringing more lost people to Himself. There may be many reminders of the fleetingness of things, as the sandcastles illustrated, but let's use this as an opportunity to fix our eyes on Jesus, the light of the world, hopeful and expectant of all that God will do in the next term.

The next Ladies Event is on Saturday 6th December.
















Sunday Series



This term during our Sunday services we will be looking at the book of Philippians together. You may already know some verses from this book as they are very memorable, and one of the creeds we say at St Peter's is based on chapter two of this book. Paul wrote this book to the church in Philippi from prison in Rome. He writes as the church was beginning to experience disunity and struggling against opposition as they witnessed for the gospel; helpfully, this is made clear in some key verses (1:27–28a). The letter itself is a warm and friendly letter indicating that Paul had a deep love for the church in Philippi. This letter is still relevant to us today, and I have entitled this series 'Striving together for the Gospel.' Now, I do not believe that St Peter's is currently experiencing disunity! But this letter will hopefully continue to draw us closer together, united around Christ, and with a renewed passion for sharing the Gospel even in the face of opposition.

I am praying that it will remind us of the absolute value of Christ above all things and the role of the church as a beacon of light for the world.
